



PHYSICIANS IN POSTGRADUATE TRAINING PROGRAMS. PRESCRIPTION WRITING POLICY

THE YUKON MEDICAL COUNCIL HAS ADOPTED THE FOLLOWING POLICY WITH RESPECT TO PRESCRIBING BY PHYSICIANS IN POST-GRADUATE TRAINING PROGRAMS:

Physicians in Postgraduate Training Programs, who have completed a minimum of three (3) months of postgraduate training, may be allowed to prescribe, under supervision, any medications, including narcotics, to patients seen under the auspices of their training program.

Any request for prescription writing privileges must be supported by the post-graduate's Provincial Program Director.

Request for this privilege must be made by way of the prescribed form titled "Post Graduate Physician in Training - Prescription Undertaking", and must be signed by both the post-graduate trainee and the provincial program director.

All prescriptions must include the printed name and signature of the Physician-in-training, the physician's level of training, and the name of the Yukon preceptor.

All unused Triplicate Prescription Pads (TPP's) must be returned to the Council on the expiry date of the temporary practice certificate.

The Council reserves the right to withdraw prescribing privileges at any time.
